

CHURCH OF ST EDMUND, ASSINGTON, SUFFOLK

The parish church of St Edmund in Assington, Suffolk is a Grade I listed building dating from the 14th century built from flint and dressed stone. The church was restored and largely rebuilt in its original style during the 19th century however, it needed a 21st century solution from M.R. Site Services Limited to weatherproof the roof without disturbing the original medieval roofing timbers.

The company manufactured bespoke roofing sheets and support systems, aluminium gutters and flashings. All joints were fully site welded using a remote welding process with all plant and heavy equipment retained within the site vehicle. This accurate seam welding is ideal for heritage projects where it is essential to protect the original fabric of the building.
